We are now able to offer flu vaccines to all patients over the age of 50.

We are having a late night clinic on Monday 14th December from 6pm-9pm.

If you are over 50 year old and would like a free flu vaccine, please contact us to book an appointment.



From everyone at Teams Medical Practice we would like to wish you all a very Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

Please ensure you contact us to renew your contraceptive pill in advance well before you are due to run out. We have changed our system for this recently and instead of us booking you for a telephone appointment we will be passing your details to our nursing team who will have a look at your records to see if you need a telephone appointment or not. We will then contact you to let you know.

Reminder to check your medication stocks for over the Christmas period and order your medication in good time to ensure you do not run out over the holidays.

We are closed Friday 25th December, Monday 28th December and Friday 1st January.

Any medication requests placed after we close on Thursday 24th December would then not be received by us until Tuesday 29th December when we return to the practice. This means the medication wouldn't be at the pharmacy until the day after that for regular repeat prescriptions and some chemists then require another 24 hours after that to process the medications. Some items can take longer than this depending on whether they are in your repeat list or not.

As you are aware due to the current situation with Covid most appointments are now telephone appointments. Just to make you aware calls from the practice can be from a different telephone number to the practice all together or from a withheld number.

If you have booked a phone appointment please ensure you are able to take the call. The same as any appointments there are sometimes delays calling you. If you have booked a phone appointment but do not receive a call on time please do not contact us straight away as sometimes clinics can be delayed.

Please ensure your phone is able to accept incoming calls from withheld numbers.

Covid vaccine – The vaccine has now been approved. We have already had numerous calls from patients about this. We do not yet know when we will start to deliver these. Once we know more information we will contact those who are eligible. Please do not call us.
