## Practice Newsletter November 2020



When attending the practice for appointments we have a new intercom system for entering the practice. Please ensure you press the button that is lit up when it is close to your appointment time. Be aware that if you attend too early for the appointment you will be asked to wait outside and asked to press the buzzer again nearer your time.

The Big Local Gateshead have started a new pen-pal service with the care homes in the area to help everyone feel more connected. It's open to everyone, no matter your age or writing ability.

How it works:

Write an introduction letter giving out only your first name and not any other personal information, for instance "I am Kelly, I live in Teams and have 2 children". Please do not seal the envelopes by licking them. You could talk about things you enjoy, your family and friends or the places you like to go. You can ask questions to get a conversation going. Some of the recipients will be writing with help of a carer but some will be writing by themselves so give them plenty of prompts to encourage them. Write a separate list of your hobbies and interests on the front of the envelope, this will help the recipients choose a pen-pal with something in common.

Try to keep the letter friendly, informal and short (less than a single size of A4). Use large font or clear handwriting.

Once you have finished the letter just pop it in the red post box outside of the Big Local Bungalow on Derwentwater Road.

The Big Local will then take the letters to a care home and their staff will match you with a resident and help them write you a reply.

All of the replies will be at the pop up shop for you to collect – just ask a volunteer if there is any post for you. Put your reply in an envelope with your pen pals name on it when you are allocated one.

Please ensure you contact us to renew your contraceptive pill in advance well before you are due to run out. We have changed our system for this recently and instead of us booking you for a telephone appointment we will be passing your details to our nursing team who will have a look at your records to see if you need a telephone appointment or not. We will then contact you to let you know.
